# STUDENT DROP-OFF PICK-UP

### End of Day Process

Any students arriving after 9:10am MUST sign in at the office. If you are picking up your child(ren) early please send a note to your child's teacher in advance.

There will be no early pick-ups after 3:15 - 3:30pm as our staff are busy

preparing the students for end of day dismissal. We understand that there may be times when an early dismissal is needed, please send in a note to your child's teacher or send an email before the school day begins informing us of the end of day changes. All students signing out early must be signed OUT at the office and then meet their parent/guardian or approved pick up person outside the front doors. We are attempting to limit the interruptions during classroom instruction time. We cannot ensure that calls made at the last minute to the office at the end of the day will result in the proper directions reaching the student and the student accurately following these changes. If you need to change any emergency contact information and/or those that are authorized to pickup your children, you must submit this in writing.

PARKING Thank you to all parents who have been parking on the street and walking to pick up their students at the end of the day. We understand this is not the most convenient situation for you, but it is the safest option for our students and community members who are pedestrians and we greatly appreciate your cooperation and understanding. Please make sure you are abiding by the traffic rules and only parking in designated areas as the Bylaw enforcement officers are present and will be enforcing parking expectations. This includes parking within the posted signs and not in front of the school driveways or our neighbours' driveways. Our parking lot will continue to be closed between 3:15 p.m. and 3:40 p.m. Please do not enter the parking lot from either entrance after 3:15 p.m. During this 25 minute time period, cars will be unable to enter or leave the parking lot. This is to reduce


traffic and to help ensure the safety of all our students being dismissed at the end of the school day. Please do not pull into or park in the lot if you need to leave before 3:40 pm. If you are parking in our lot at the end of the day, feel free to use any open parking spaces and please make sure your engines are turned off and not idling. This is important for the health and well-being of the families who are waiting for our students.

If the lot is closed, please find a spot on the street, rather than moving or driving over the pylons. There may be times or reasons when the parking lot is closed early. We appreciate your understanding during these times. During morning drop off, 8:55 a.m. – 9:10 a.m., we are still seeing a number of vehicles stopping, parking and unloading children in the driving lane. This is not safe! If you need to get out of your car and watch your child walk into the building, please park in a parking spot and walk your children to the gate, rather than stopping the flow of the kiss and ride. If drivers wait patiently and unload along the curb, students will be more safe and the flow of the kiss and ride will move along as it should. Please do not park along the drop off zone. When possible, move as far up along the sidewalk as space allows. Have your students exit the vehicle from the LEFT hand side, closest to the gate entrance. These routines will become more important as the weather changes and there are snow piles causing visibility challenges.

Student safety is our number one priority at Chris Hadfield Public School and we appreciate your assistance as we work through these new routines. We need to work together to ensure the safety of all our children.

### Notice to Students and Parents/Guardians of Students Regarding Out-of-Area-Requests

Under Simcoe County District School Board procedures (APM A7000 – School Attendance Areas), it is possible for students to apply for and receive permission to attend an out-of-attendance-area school. Students will be permitted to continue in attendance as long as there are pupil places available. They may be required to return to their home school or transfer to another school when the capacity of the school they are attending has been reached and space is required for students residing within the designated attendance areas. An approval may be revoked at any time by the superintendent of education, after consultation with the receiving school principal, for reasons related to the student's behaviour, attendance, actions or inactions. Transportation to and from school is the responsibility of the out-ofattendance-area student and/or parent/guardian.







### SCDSB Character Education Program

### Inclement Weather and Bus Cancellation Information Reminder

All information regarding cancelled buses in Simcoe County is posted on the Simcoe County Student Transportation Consortium (SCSTC)'s bus information website at www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca. Our school is in the **SOUTH ZONE**. When buses are cancelled, schools remain open for student learning, unless otherwise noted. School staff are expected to plan for such emergencies in order to transition students who are unable to attend due to inclement weather, to their online platforms (Google Classroom and/or SCDSBhub) and continue with

academic programming. It is always a family decision whether or not it is safe for their child(ren) to leave for school under severe weather conditions.

The Consortium and bus operators try to make the decision to cancel school buses before 6 a.m. and make every effort to post announcements before 7 a.m. Inclement weather cancellations are effective for the whole day and buses cancelled in the morning will not run at the end of the day. ### SCDSB Anti-Sex Trafficking Protocol and Resources for Parents/Guardians

In 2021-22, the Ministry of Education directed Ontario school boards to develop an anti-sex trafficking protocol that was tailored to the needs of their community. The Simcoe County District School Board (SCDSB) has developed a protocol and relevant training and resources for staff, students and parents/guardians. The focus of the SCDSB's protocol and resources is to protect students and empower school communities to play a key role in fighting sex trafficking and keeping children and youth safe from sexual exploitation.

The Ministry of Education has directed all Ontario school boards to begin implementing the recommendations outlined in the Right to Read Inquiry. As a result, primary educators are shifting from using leveled texts for reading instruction as they encourage reliance on guessing strategies to solve unknown words. Instead, educators are beginning to use a scope and sequence to systematically teach phonemic awareness (awareness of the sounds in words) and phonics (understanding of the letters that represent sounds). Students may apply the phonics

skills they have learned by reading 'decodable' or 'phonetically controlled' texts.

As a result, educators are moving away from using PM Benchmarks and moving towards assessments that measure foundational reading skills. For example, in Grade 1, educators will be observing a child's ability to identify the sounds they hear in a word, identify the letter(s) that represent the sound, and their ability to blend the sounds together to decode (read) the word and encode (write) the word. In later primary, educators will be observing a child's understanding of more complex letter/sound relationships such as prefixes and suffixes.

Educators will also consider a child's achievement in reading fluency, vocabulary development, and reading comprehension when assigning a report card grade for reading.


